

THE PROGRAM

Thomas Merton, born in France in 1915, the son of artists, is arguably, in terms of Christian spirituality, the most important writer of the second half of the 20th century.

Having lived in France and England, he studied at Columbia University in New York. There in New York he was baptized as a Roman Catholic, and later joined the austere Trappist order of monks at the Abbey of Gethsemani, in Kentucky. In his all too short life (he died in Thailand in 1968), he was many things: poet, social critic, ecumenist, calligrapher, Zen photographer, novice master, journalist, diarist and practitioner of inter-faith dialogue. However, it is as a contemplative, both as monk and writer, that Merton offers us his greatest gifts, in the frenetic and disconnected society in which we live today.

In 1940, aged 25, and wanting, after his baptism, to spend some time in a Catholic

country, Merton went to Cuba, where he visited Havana, Matanzas, Camagüey, Santiago de Cuba and the shrine at El Cobre.

At the time, Cuba was a dictatorship, a virtual fief of the United States, and a playground for the Mafia and their friends. Merton's visit, as recorded in his journal, is as notable for what he

didn't see — colonialism, political oppression, Santería — as for what he did. On this study tour, we will visit the places Merton visited, see something of what he saw, and attempt also to see some of what he didn't.

With the help of our interpreter, we will meet Cubans and explore religion and society in Cuba today. We also plan to relax at one of Cuba's most beautiful beachside cities, Trinidad.

So join us, *por favor*, for a fabulous winter holiday that will also introduce you to or acquaint you further with one of the great writers and thinkers of our time.

PILGRIMAGE FACULTY

An Anglican priest, he is director of the Pacific Jubilee Program in Spiritual Formation and Spiritual Direction at Vancouver School of Theology. Currently he is preparing for a six-month pilgrimage/hike in the United Kingdom in 2006. He is also a lover of Shakespeare and the tango.



JUDITH HARDCASTLE is program director of the Thomas Merton Society of Canada. In her third year of M.Div. studies at Vancouver School of Theology, she is a candidate for ministry in The United Church of Canada. She is particularly interested in Merton as pilgrim of wisdom and peace. Judith has organized and led previous Merton pilgrimages with Donald Grayston to France, New York and Alaska.

REGISTRATION

As the tour is limited to 18 people, we advise early registration. Minimum age is 19 unless traveling with a parent or guardian.

COST

Land cost: \$1,995 (includes 14 nights accommodation, breakfast and dinner daily, ground transportation by air-conditioned coach, services of a Cuban guide, instructors and interpreter). Cost is based on double occupancy. Single occupancy, if desired and available, will be at an additional charge of \$350.00.

Airfare: \$619 (Toronto/Havana return) or \$929 (Vancouver/Toronto/Havana return), plus taxes. Our group booking is on Air Canada scheduled flights.

Cost does not include:

- Lunches
- Cuban departure tax of \$25 (pay locally in Cuban convertible pesos)
- Health and accident insurance
- Alcoholic beverages
- Excess baggage charges
- Individual accommodation surcharges, tips, or expenses arising from any causes beyond the reasonable control of the tour leader
- Taxes on airfare

DOCUMENTATION

A valid passport is required for travel to Cuba.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Before Nov. 4: Your deposit will be refunded less a \$75.00 processing fee.

Between Nov. 4 and Nov. 23: A full refund, less the processing fee, will be possible only if someone from the waitlist is available.

After Nov. 23: No refund will be possible. Original receipts issued by the TMSC must accompany any refund request. The Thomas Merton Society of Canada reserves the right to cancel the tour in the event of insufficient registration.
